Day 1 (2024)

Windhoek

Upon your arrival, your respective guide and the representative of our company (Mhof Tours and Safaris) will welcome you to Namibia the land of the brave. He will transfer you to your first accommodation at The Elegant Guesthouse. After freshening up from the long flight, your guide will advise you on the time he will meet you at the main area for a city tour to explore Windhoek the capital city of Namibia. However, he will take you to the most important historical areas. Your guide will join you for dinner at one of the most famous restaurants in Windhoek, where he will brief you in detail about your safari within Namibia. Dinner is booked at Joe's Beer House.

Day 2 (2024)

Windhoek to Kalahari Desert Area

This morning just after the breathtaking breakfast you head the road to the South/East towards the Kalahari Desert to Lapa Lange Game Ranch Lodge. You arrive at the lodge in time for lunch. After settle in you will meet with your local guide at the lobby and be off on your first activity whereby you will walk on at your leisure. After the activity you return back to the lodge whilst you explore the breathtaking air and the red dunes. You freshen up for your dinner and the rest of the night is spent at your siesta.

Kalahari Desert:

Kalahari Desert, large basin like plain of the interior plateau of Southern Africa. It occupies almost all of Botswana, the eastern third of Namibia, and the northern most part of Northern Cape province in South Africa.

Lapa Lange Game Ranch Lodge:

Lapa Lange Game Lodge is located in South Central Namibia, on the edge of the Kalahari. Day 3 (2024)

Kalahari Desert Area to Namib Naukluft Park (Sossusvlei)



Today after scrumptious breakfast you head the road to one of the well-known and one of the famous highlights of Namibia to Namib Naukluft National Park. Lunch is had en route. You arrive at Namib Desert Lodge in the mid - afternoon where you stay for two nights whilst you explore the remarkable sights of Namib Desert with your guide. After you settle in the afternoon is spent on afternoon scenic nature drive and tranquil surroundings at Namib Desert Lodge. If there is still time today, your guide will take you to visit Sesriem Canyon, a nearby geological attraction. You return to the lodge to freshen up for dinner.

Day 4 (2024)

Namib Naukluft Park (Sossusvlei)

This morning after an early wake – up call you will meet at the lobby where you will have coffee/tea and rusk. You set off to Namib Naukluft Park with your private guide in your private vehicle on Sossusvlei Excursion. The Earlier you leave to join the queue to the entrance for Sossusvlei the better. You stand the chance to capture the dunes whilst the light is soft and the shadows accentuate the towering shapes and the curves of the dunes. After the most awesome experience by climbing the highest dune called big daddy at Sossusvlei. Once you explored Sossusvlei and Deadvlei and surroundings dune fields. You will enjoy a relaxed picnic brunch under the shade of camelthorn trees. You return to the lodge in the earlier afternoon in time for late lunch. The late afternoon can be spent to visit Sesriem Canyon afterwards if you haven't visited the canyon the previous day. The rest of the day is spent at your leisure.

Sossusvlei:

Conservation area with restricted entrance and movement in the area. Entrance fees to be paid upon entry. Sossusvlei is located in the southern part of the Namib Desert, in the Namib – Naukluft Park of Namibia, a prime destination in Namibia that showcases mammoth sand dunes up 325m in height. Sossusvlei is a salt and clay pan surrounded by high red dunes. The name "Sossusvlei" is often used in an extended meaning to refer to the surrounding area, which is one of the major visitor attractions of Namibia.

Day 5 (2024)

Namib Naukluft Park to Swakopmund

The attractive drive today takes you northwest through awesome and ever-changing desert landscapes of the Namib Naukluft National Park, including the impressive Ghaub and Kuiseb Canyon via Kuiseb pass. You will meet the coast at the port town of Walvis Bay and then continue north to Swakopmund where you can enjoy the pleasant seaside location and cooler coastal breeze for your next two nights. This afternoon is spent on 1-hour Quad biking and the late. After the quad biking activity, you can still explore the town along the waterfront on foot, on your way to the restaurant for your dinner at one of the local restaurants.

Swakopmund:

Swakopmund is much loved by Namibians as a welcome respite from the heat of the interior. It is also popular among visitors because of its old-world charm and relaxed atmosphere. Founded in 1892 during German colonial rule, it served as the territory's main harbour for many years. Today this quaint desert town, hedged between desert and sea, is enhanced by lush green lawns, elegant palm trees and carefully tended public gardens. Swakop has wide choice of hotels, pensions and restaurants and several coffee shops selling traditional cakes and pastries. The coast with its desert hinterland offers many options, both for adventure and for relaxation.



Quad Biking:

Quad biking is the best way to experience the pristine beauty of the Namib Desert and its magnificent dunes. No prior experience is needed and you will never be too old to do a guided bike excursion. On our tours we do multi – guiding with slow and fast groups in the same tour, catering for both the adrenaline seeker and the visitor.

Atlantic Garden Boutique Hotel:

Located in Swakopmund, 400 metres from The Mole Beach, Atlantic Garden Boutique Hotel provides accommodation with a garden, free private parking and a bar. The property is close to Otavi-Bahnhof, Hohenzollernhaus and German Evangelical Lutheran Church. The accommodation offers a 24-hour front desk, airport transfers, a tour desk and free WiFi. Guest rooms in the hotel are equipped with a coffee machine. Each room is equipped with a private bathroom with a shower, free toiletries and a hairdryer. Swakopmund

This morning you will be off to Walvisbay for your boat cruise to check in on time. Your guide will accompany you once there is space available. You will be drop of at the waterfront after having the most awesome sightings for the marine wildlife. You might be lucky to spot the humpback whale. You will enjoy Oysters, Sparkling wine, trademark platters with delicious snack and local brewed Namibia beer. You will return to the waterfront.

After the morning boat cruise, you will be collected by your guide from sandwich harbor tour upon your arrival at waterfront. The breathtaking 4x4 ride towards the Sandwich Harbour to explore the stunning view on this tour. This drive will take you on magnificent scenic drive along the Walvis Bay Lagoon and the salt mines. If you are lucky you might spot some flamingos. You return to waterfront and meet with your private guide and you return to Swakopmund from Walvisbay after one of the remarkable activities and long day. You will freshen up for your dinner and the dinner is had at any of the local restaurants which your guide will choose.

Catamaran Boat Cruise:

We set sail daily from the Walvisbay Waterfront. Most of the visitors to Namibia travel to see exquisite landscapes and majestic wildlife. Yet, few ever consider Namibia's maritime wildlife as part of their game safaris. At Catamaran Charters we change all that. On our educational dolphin and seal cruises, guests get front row seats to watch seals being boisterous and stand a good chance to be introduced to the eccentric –looking great white pelican and that is only the beginning. You will have an excellent chance of seeing at least one of the more common members of the Marine Big 5 as we are often accosted by Bottlenose, Heaviside and Dusky dolphins who look to satisfy their curiosity. The unconventional mola or sunfish is a highlight for many of our guests and we have had regular sightings of equally impressive leatherback Turtles. How better to round off a perfect morning with Oysters and Sparkling wine, followed by our trademark platters with savoury snacks, coffee/tea and cakes while we leisurely sail the South – Atlantic Namibian coastline. Since all four our catamarans are sailing catamarans, we enjoy letting guests enjoy the true experience of sailing. Continuing on your safari today, the road takes you north and east into the wonderful and diverse region of Damaraland. You pass Namibia's highest mountain, the Brandberg which peaks at 2,573 m above sea level, and take time to view game and absorb the vastness of the scenery along the way. Damaraland is typified by displays of colour, magnificent table topped mountains, rock formations and bizarre-looking vegetation. The landscape in this area has been formed by the erosion of wind, water and geological forces which have formed rolling hills, dunes, gravel plains and ancient river terraces. It is the variety and loneliness of the area as well as the scenic splendour which will reward and astound you, giving one an authentic understanding of the word 'wilderness'. If time allows this afternoon your guide will take you to visit the nearby attractions and geological sites of the pre-historic Twyfelfontein rock engravings (a UNESCO World Heritage Site) - if not there is plenty of time to see them tomorrow.

Twyfelfontein:

Strewn over a hillside amongst flat-topped mountains of red sandstone, Twyfelfontein's boulders and slabs of red sandstone hold some 2,500 prehistoric engravings that depict wildlife, animal spoor and abstract motifs. It is perhaps the largest and finest collection of petroglyphs in Africa. The engravings show animals such as elephant, giraffe, kudu, lion, rhinoceros, springbok, zebra and ostrich that once used to drink from a fountain at the bottom of the hill. In some cases, footprints were engraved instead of hooves or paws. The abstract motifs feature mainly circles. Stone tools and other artefacts found at Twyfelfontein suggest that hunter-gatherers occupied the site over a period of perhaps 7,000 years. These days a local guide accompanies visitors to showcase the rock art. The engravings lie along two circular routes, one an hour's climb and the other 40 minutes longer. Twyfelfontein is one of Namibia's key National Monuments and is a UNESCO World Heritage Site.

Twyfelfontein Country Lodge:

The lodge—nestled along the mountainside—blends beautifully with its surroundings. Its design complements the sandstone rock formations with minimal visual impact on this picturesque landscape, utilizing natural stone, carefully selected paint colours, and thatched roofs.

Enjoy the beautiful views of the Huab Valley, desert plains, and distant mountains from the deck provide hours of relaxed comfort, peace, and tranquillity. Twyfelfontein is more than just a place to stay—it is a destination in and of itself.

Day 8 (2024)

Damaraland

After an early breakfast you will be off on an exciting 4x4 excursion along the ephemeral Aba Huab and Huab River valleys to explore this remarkable region and to search for game, including the elusive desert adapted elephants if they are in the area. Damaraland is home to a variety of desert adapted wildlife and hidden desert treasures. As the elephants are mostly active in the mornings you will normally have the best chance to see them then before returning to lodge for lunch. Since it can get very hot during the day you can spend the afternoon at the pool after lunch whilst you are at your leisure. The late afternoon is spent to visit the Damara Living museum. You return after the activity and freshen up for your dinner.

Desert Adapted Elephant:

In habitats with sufficient vegetation and water an adult elephant consumes as much as 300 kg of roughage and 230 litres of water every day of its life. Consider what a herd of them would eat and drink in a week or a month or a year. Well, you might not only spot the elephants, but other large mammals as well, such as black rhinoceros and giraffe, and if you are lucky you might spot the desert adapted lions as well. Their ranges extend from river catchments in northern Kaokoveld as far south as the northern Namib. Apart from the Kunene River, seven river courses northwards from the Ugab provide them with possible routes across the desert, right to the Skeleton Coast. The biggest are the Hoarusib, the Hoanib, the Huab and the Ugab Rivers. Desert adapted elephant in Kaokoland and the Namib walk further for water and fodder than any other elephant in Africa. The distances between waterholes and feeding grounds can be as great as 68 km. The typical home range of a family herd is larger than 2,000 km², or eight times as big as ranges in central Africa where rainfall is much higher. They walk and feed at night and rest during the day. To meet their nutritional and bulk requirements they browse on no fewer than 74 of the 103-plant species that grow in their range. Not a separate species or even a subspecies, they are an ecotype unique to Namibia in Africa south of the equator, behaviourally adapted to hyper-arid conditions. Elephant in Mali on the southwestern fringe of the Sahara Desert are the only others known to survive in similar conditions.

Day 9 (2024)

Damaraland to Opuwo

Just after breakfast, you will continue on your safari to Opuwo. You will arrive mid-afternoon in time for a light lunch at Opuwo Country Lodge. After you settle in, you will meet your tour guide at the main area together with the local guide who will accompany you to go visit the Himba village and to learn more about the Himba people culture. You will return to Opuwo Country Lodge to freshen up and to have your dinner. The rest of the night is spent on your siesta after the long day.

Himba People:

The Himba people are a semi-nomadic tribe who have lived in northern Namibia for centuries. They are known for their distinctive red ochre body paint and intricate jewellery, as well as their deep-rooted cultural traditions and beliefs.



Opuwo Country Lodge:

Opuwo Country Lodge has 28 luxury rooms consist of 21 twins, 1 luxury double room and 3 sets of Inter-leading twin rooms (6 rooms) and 12 standard twin rooms. All the rooms have air conditioning and en-suit shower, toilet with complimentary amenities. The campsite is also situated on the hill +- 500meters away from the lodge. The 12 Large have 220v electricity (24hours), ablution facilities with hot and cold water, each with barbeque area and a communal wash up facility. Deck chairs and umbrellas set the scene for a relaxed day around the pool or cool off after a hard day's drive. Next to the pool is the Bar and Restaurant where guests can crack a cold one and enjoy mouth-watering meals.

Opuwo to West Etosha National Park

You return for dinner and right after the dinner your local guide from the Hobatere Lodge will take you on spectacular night drive. You return to the lodge and the rest of the night is spent at your siesta.

Day 11 (2024)

West Etosha National Park to Southern Etosha National Park

Today after breakfast you will enter Etosha National Park through the Galton Gate on the western side of the park. As you enter the park you start with the game drive throughout the entire road toward Okaukuejo Resort. After arriving and checking in at Okaukuejo Resort you meet with your guide at the main area and will be off in your private vehicle on afternoon game viewing drive to visit one of the famous waterholes. If you are lucky you will spot the predators but otherwise you will see zebras, giraffes, elephants, rhinos, and many different species of antelope. You return to the resort before they close the gates by sunset, the rest of the evening can be spent on game viewing at the camp's floodlit waterhole while enjoying dinner, and afterwards.

Etosha National Park:

Etosha National Park covers 22,270 km², of which approximately 5,000 km² is made up of saline depressions or 'pans'. The largest of these pans, the Etosha Pan, can be classified as a saline desert in its own right. The Etosha Pan lies in the Owambo Basin, on the north-western edge of the Namibian Kalahari Desert. Until three million years ago it formed part of huge, shallow lake that was reduced to a complex of salt pans when the major river that fed it, the Kunene, changed course and began to flow to the Atlantic instead. If the lake existed today, it would be the third largest in the world. Etosha is the largest of the pans at 4,760 km² in extent. It is nowadays filled with water only when sufficient rain falls to the north in Angola, inducing floods to flow southward along the Cuvelai drainage system. The Park consists of grassland, woodland and savannah. Game-viewing centers around the numerous springs and waterholes where several different species can often be seen at one time. The Park boasts some 114 mammal and over 340 bird species. Wildlife that one might see includes elephant, lion, giraffe, blue wildebeest, eland, kudu, gemsbok (oryx), zebra, rhino, cheetah, leopard, hyena, honey badger and warthog, as well as the endemic black faced impala.



Okaukuejo Resort:

At the Southern entrance to the Etosha National Park, Okaukuejo is the park's oldest and most popular resort. A floodlit waterhole visited by plenty of game especially after sunset, gives Okaukuejo its special character and provides guests with hours of entertainment and the opportunity to see animals such as elephant and black rhino from close by. The resorts have luxury and standard bungalows, en-suite rooms, swimming pool, post office, filling station and conference facilities.

Day 12 (2024)

Southern Etosha National Park

Today after early breakfast you will be of on another exciting morning guided game drive within the Etosha National Park, to see more of the wide variety of game and bird species that are to be found there. You might be very lucky to see the early predator hunting. Lunch is had en route. You drive back after lunch and continue with your game drive. Your return to Okaukuejo Resort before sunset. You return to the resort before they close the gates by sunset, the rest of the evening can be spent on game viewing at the camp's floodlit waterhole while enjoying dinner, and afterwards.

Travel Info

Namibia is situated in the South – Western corner of Africa and is a land of remarkable contrasts. Despite its size (four times the size of Great Britain), It is sparsely populated with an estimated population of 2.1 Million people. The small population is largely due to the arid conditions, with a national average rainfall of 270mm per year.

Visa:

It is advisable to double –check visa requirements for your country of origin prior to travelling Visas are valid for up to three months from date of entry.

Time Zone:

GMT+2 in the summer (the first Sunday in September to the first Sunday in April);
GMT+1 in the winter (the first Sunday in April to the first Sunday in September)

Electricity:

220volts AC50hz

Mobile Phones:

Mobile communication system is GSM, roaming agreements exist with most international mobile phone operators. Coverage is limited areas.

Internet:

There are internet cafes situated throughout the country and most hospitality establishments offer an internet service.

Shopping:

Windhoek and Swakopmund offer a selection of stylish shops. Local crafts are sold in specialised, shops, as well as at street markets, most shops are open from Monday to Saturday, with selected shops and street markets open daily.

Money:

The Namibian Dollar (NAD: symbol N\$) is the country's official currency.it is equivalent to the South African Rand which is also legal tender in Namibia.

Currency Exchange:

Traveller's cheques can be exchanged during normal banking hours at any of the commercial banks, or at bureau de change offices.

Credit Cards:

American Express, Diners Club, MasterCard and Visa are accepted. Check with your credit/debit card company for details of merchant acceptability and other services which may be available. Credit cards are not usually accepted at petrol station. ATM's for cash withdrawal are readily available in all towns.

Air Travel:

The National airline is Air Namibia, offering daily flights from Frankfurt to Windhoek. British Airways, South African Airways, Air Berlin and TAAG also fly to Namibia. Flying time from Frankfurt to Windhoek is 11 hours and flying time between Windhoek and Johannesburg/Cape Town is 2 hours. Departure taxes are levied but included in the ticket price.



Air Charter:

Visitors pressed for time may opt to travel from A to B by air. Planes can be chartered from several reputable charter companies.

Travelling by Road:

Namibia has approximately 5 450km of well-maintained tarred roads and 37 000km of gravel roads which differ in condition. Vehicles travel on the left-hand side of road. Self-drive visitors should exercise caution when driving on gravel roads. Do not exceed 80km/h.

Car Hire:

All major international car rentals are represented in Namibia. Vehicles are available at the Airport and Windhoek city centre, as well as some of the other major centres. An International Driving Permit is required.

What to Pack:

Namibia has typical semi-desert climate with hot days and cool nights. It is therefore advisable to include both summer and winter clothing.

Checklist:

A small first aid kit, sunglasses, sun protection cream, a hat, moisturizing lotion and lip balm, comfortable walking shoes, a swimsuit, binoculars, toiletries, a small torch, travel insurance documents, and a telephone list (of family/friends/medical practitioner back home to contact in case of emergency) are recommended.

Health:

Private medical care in major towns and cities is good, especially in Windhoek. There are several private clinics which maintain international standards. Most remote towns have a modest hospital or clinic.

Vaccinations:

Take the usual precautions and consult your doctor. There are no mandatory vaccinations for travelers from Europe. The risk of contracting malaria is restricted mainly to three northern parts of the country and is usually limited to the wet summer months.

Insurance:

It is advisable to take out foreign travel health insurance which includes cover for repatriation. When signing for insurance, ensure that the cost for emergency flights within Namibia is covered, as well as repatriation to your home country. Emergency air evacuation is generally reliable if all paperwork is available and in order. Ensure your contract and passport are easily accessible in case of an emergency.

Weather:

The Namib Desert coastline is usually cool with a thick coastal fog. The country has summer rainfall. Summer temperatures are high while the nights are cool. Winter nights can be very cold, but days are generally pleasant. In summer (September to April) the average interior temperature ranges from 20-34C during the day. Temperatures above 40C are often recorded in the extreme north and south of the country. The coast has a relatively stable range of 15-25C. In Winter (April-September) temperatures in the interior range from 18-25C during the day and can drop to below freezing at night.
